ABOUT NJIT

NJIT is New Jersey's Science & Technology University. With roots going back to 1881, when it was founded as Newark Technical School, New Jersey Institute of Technology observed its 125th anniversary in 2006.

Located in University Heights, Newark, NJ, home to more than 30,000 college students, NJIT's campus is just 10 miles from New York City.

Playing a critical role in reshaping New Jersey's future, NJIT, as a major public technological university, is an important pipeline for the flow of technology into society. The university's educational programs prepare students to be leaders in the technology-dependent economy of the 21st century. University researchers seek new knowledge to improve processes and products for industry. Through public and private partnerships and economic development efforts, the university helps to grow new business ventures that fuel the economy.

In recent years, NJIT has put more than \$83 million toward new and improved buildings and facilities on the 45-acre campus, including biomedical engineering labs and a campus center.

NJIT offers 92 degree programs, 33 undergraduate, 40 master's and 19 doctoral programs, through six schools: Newark College of Engineering, New Jersey School of Architecture, College of Science and Liberal Arts, School of Management, Albert Dorman Honors College and College of Computing Sciences.

NJIT has 416 full-time faculty; more than 98 percent of whom hold the highest degree in their field. The student-faculty ratio is 13:1; with more than 5,200 undergraduate students and nearly 2,800 graduate students. Our students hail from 33 states and more than 100 countries to rank eighth in the nation for diversity. Albert Dorman Honors College enrolls more than 500 students who take advantage of honors courses, research opportunities, advising and mentoring. Honors College students have SAT scores ranking in the top 10 percent nationally.



COACHING STAFF

AL ALONSO Head Coach



In 2003, when NJIT revived its men's cross country program and added a women's team for the first time, Adalberto M. Alonso, PE, was the ideal candidate to coach both programs.

With NJIT's move to Division 1, he added responsibility as head coach of the new men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams.

Prior to NJIT, Alonso spent 19 years as the head men's coach and 11 as head women's coach at Stevens. He was the first coach of the Ducks' women's program. Steven's men's teams won their final 53 dual meets under Alonso, and never had a losing season. His women's teams were 28-12 and won their last 18 dual meets.

He was the youngest head coach in Stevens history in any sport and ranks first alltime at the school in winning percentage in any sport. He was inducted into the Stevens Hall of Fame in 2006.

Alonso was named Independent Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 1993, 1995, and 1996, and has produced 39 all-conference runners, including five at NJIT.

As an undergraduate at Stevens, Alonso was instrumental in making cross country a varsity sport. He was president of the Ducks' club team his first two years. Then as a junior, he led the inaugural varsity squad to the IAC championship.

Alonso also earned a bachelor of engineering degree in electrical engineering from Stevens in 1983 and an MBA from Fairleigh Dickinson University in 1988. He is a licensed professional engineer in the state of New Jersey and has Level-2-certification from United States of America Track & Field (USATF). He resides in West New York, NJ.

DAVID CZEIZINGER

Assistant Coach - Cross Country



David Czeizinger has been a collegiate assistant coach for 15 years, including five with the Highlanders.

Czeizinger's coaching career started as a volunteer assistant at Stevens under coach Alonso. After one season, Alonso hired him to help build the women's team to a conference championship level.

The Ducks, who struggled to a 5-8 dual meet record in the first year before his arrival, went 23-4 over the next seven seasons. In that time, they won the first conference title in school history and had an individual league champion for the first time. Czeizinger has been an avid runner for more than 25 years and still competes in the master's division from the mile to the marathon. He is a 1978 graduate of Stevens, with a degree in materials engineering.

KING PERRY

Assistant Coach - Track & Field

King Perry, a former outstanding track athlete, who previously coached at four different New Jersey high schools, joined the NJIT cross country and track and field coaching staffs for the 2006-07 season.

A resident of Passaic, NJ, Perry was a star hurdler in high school (Passaic Tech) and college (Long Island University-Brooklyn).

He was an Olympic Trials qualifier in 2000 and ranked 14th in the United States among high school hurdlers.

He owns the fourth-best 400-meter hurdles time for Passaic County in the decade of the 1990s and the sixth-best time at 110-meter high hurdles for the county in the decade. In field events, he owns the decade's second-best long jump, fourth-best triple jump and eighth-best high jump.

In college, he is the Northeast Conference record holder for the indoor 55-meter high hurdles (7.47) and he was NEC champ in both the 55 and 110-meter high hurdles.

He has served as coach at Lincoln High School in Jersey City, NJ, as well as at Bishop Francis Essex Catholic High in East Orange, at Hawthorne HS and at Passaic High. He has coached five individual champions, most recently the state Group IV outdoor long jump champion and the top two boys 55-meter Passaic County finishers in 2006. He has also coached football at the high school and middle schools levels.

AL SIUTA Volunteer Coach - Cross Country/Track & Field



Al Siuta, a former runner for NJIT, joins the Highlanders coaching staff in 2008-09 as a volunteer assistant coach with the cross country, indoor track and field and outdoor track and field teams.

Siuta, who also ran at Roselle (NJ) Catholic High School, remains an active runner at the Masters level, competing in middle distance and long distance races.

He has 10 years experience coaching at the youth level (11-14 years old) and

coached four teams to their age group national championships.

He coached teams that won their state age group championships in AAU competition and numerous individual runners went on to win championships as high as the state level.

Siuta has worked since 1999 with the x-TREME RUNNING CAMP as a distance running counselor, speaker and coordinator of residential services. He also has extensive experience in race management with road races and track and field.



ATHLETIC FACILITES

The NJIT cross country and track and field teams host meets at the famed Van Cortlandt Park in the Bronx, NY and Branch Brook Park in Newark, NJ.

The teams also have a full access to all the facilities in the Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center. These include the fitness area (containing computer-controlled biking equipment, cybex resistance units, and an indoor track), two weight rooms (free-weight and hammer strength), four racquetball courts, a martial arts/fencing center, a six-lane swimming pool and four lighted outdoor hardcourt tennis courts.

The Estelle and Zoom Fleisher Athletic Center gym, home to NJIT's basketball and volleyball teams, underwent renovation in the summer of 2006.

Included in the makeover were: installation of a new floor and baskets and a repositioning of the main playing court. The gym also got new lighting, a new sound system and new scoreboards along with entirely new seating for more then 1,000 spectators after the first phase of the renovation.

Lubetkin Field, home to the men's and women's soccer teams, recently underwent a 1.2 million renovation project, including the installation of SprinTurf artificial grass and a rubberized running track. It contains lights for night competition and practice, a midfield scoreboard and pressbox facilities, and its bleachers seating can hold approximately 1,000 spectators.

In 2005, NJIT and the Newark Bears announced a 10-year partnership that cemented the downtown stadium as home of all Highlander home games.


