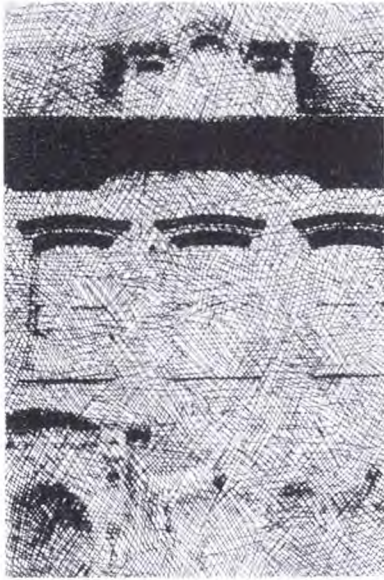




Alpha Phi Delta

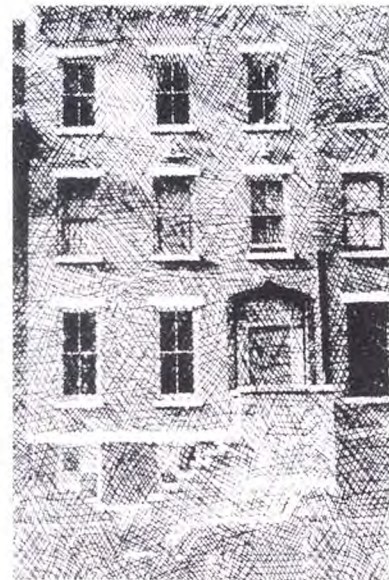

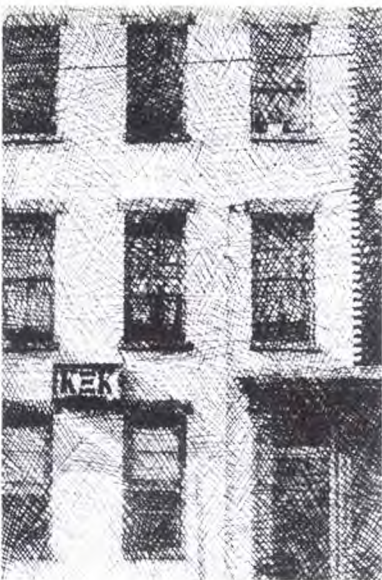




Kappa Xi Kappa

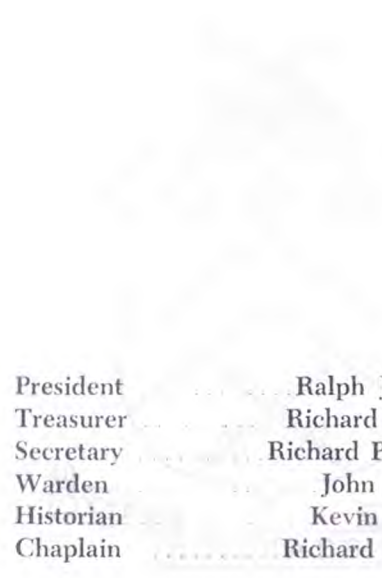




Pi Kappa Phi
